Kings Park: - Walked over the scary bridge!





SENIOR BUSH RANGERS

PALM BEACH SEAGRASS MEADOWS AND LITTLE PENGUINS

The Senior Bush Rangers visited Palm Beach to view the seagrass meadows found in their local patch. As a group, we discussed the importance of meadows in providing habitat, for oxygen production and the capture of carbon. Using washed-up seagrass and other natural materials found near the beach they created a Pete Cromer-inspired Little Penguin collage. We finished our excursion by making a short video outlining strategies Parks and Wildlife are implementing to protect the Little Penguin.

ROCKINGHAM BEACH COASTAL PLANTING

Recently at Rockingham Beach with Perth NRM and the City of Rockingham, we planted 200 seedlings in the dunes. We aimed to stabilise the dunes and add native plants to the habitat for our local critters.



YEAR 9 BUSH RANGERS

PERTH ZOO EXCURSION – AFRICAN SAFARI

Working with the Education Team at Perth Zoo, we explored the adaptations of the African animals that help them to survive in their environment. While at the Zoo, the Bush Rangers each picked one animal that they wanted to see more than anything else. It was a fabulous day.



YEAR 10 BUSH RANGERS

WA WILDLIFE

WA Wildlife cares for the sick and injured Western Australian wildlife at Bibra Lake. They came to visit us at school, introducing the Year 10 Bush Rangers to a range of beautiful animals. The little joey, a common wallaroo or euro was the star attraction for the day. We discussed how animals have come to be cared for at WA Wildlife and the measures we can take to help our wildlife.

BEACH CLEAN UPs

The Year 10 Bush Rangers removed a whooping 26.7 kilograms of marine debris from Shoalwater Islands Marine Park over the semester

YEAR 9 BUSH RANGERS

RE-CYC-OLOGY INCURSION

Simon and Dani, from the Re-Cyc-Ology project, visited the Year 9 Bush Rangers for an exciting incursion. We built bird and bat boxes to help provide habitat for animals. We discussed the importance of natural hollows and how for many reasons these are increasingly scarce. We checked our bird boxes around school, finding geckos, a huntsman spider, tail feathers, and broken eggshells. We removed boxes needing maintenance and replaced them with new ones.





YEAR 8 BUSH RANGERS

RECYCLED INSECT SCULPTURES and ANIMATIONS

The Year 8 Bush Rangers have been creatively designing and building insect sculptures using recycled materials. In our animal classification work, they used iMotion, to produce a simple animation of their plasticine amphibian creatures.

YEAR 7 BUSH RANGERS

NEARER TO NATURE INCURSION

Many Australian animals are in trouble and facing a wide range of threats, especially from feral cats and foxes. Mr C from Nearer to Nature worked with the Year 7 Bush Rangers to show how Parks and Wildlife are protecting our threatened species through the Western Shield baiting and monitoring program. The Rangers got to set a Sheffield trap and capture a soft plushie native animal.

SCHOOL PAPER RECYCLING PROJECT

The Year 7s have been remarkably busy rolling out an improved School Recycling Program. We have distributed yellow recycling bins to classrooms, sorted paper, and informed classes what should and should not go into these bins using a new infographic.

OUR NATIONAL FLAGS AND EMBLEMS



We have been busy making the Australian, Aboriginal and Torres Straits Islander flags in class. We have come to recognise the symbolism and colours of each flag. We have also discussed the Australian national emblems – the kangaroo, the emu and the wattle.
